Switch on: the real life of 10-14s

Prayer is simply talking to God. This session will help 10-14s explore the power and importance of prayer.

Play: throw and tell

There are five different types of prayer including praising God, saying sorry, thanking God, asking Him to help you, and praying for other people.

Get a sheet of paper and draw around your hand. In the outline of your fingers and thumb, write an answer to each of the statements below:

- I praise you God because... (you love me, you made me etc.)
- I'm sorry because... (I've done things that have you made you sad etc.)
- I'm thankful because... (I have a family, I have a bed to sleep in etc.)
- Please help me by... (keeping me safe etc.)
- Please help... (keep the emergency workers safe during this difficult time etc.)

Decorate your handprint and put it on your wall to remind you to talk to God everyday.

Pause: yes or no answers to prayer

Show or refer to the video clip/YouTube clip from Bruce Almighty where Bruce/God is surrounded by sticky notes of prayers then answers 'yes' to all his prayer emails at **youtu.be**. Discuss what is an answer to prayer? Is it possible for all prayers to be answered? Read Matthew Ch.26:36-46, or look it up using **www.biblegateway.com**, to see Jesus' approach to prayer.

Rewind: let's pray

As a family together, you could create a safe space to explore prayer using fun and creative prayer ideas. Here are some favourites...

- Prayer consequences like the game called consequences where you write down a word or phrase, fold over the paper and pass it on. But writing things like your name, someone you'd like to pray for, a teacher's name, a country etc. folding it over each time and passing it on.
- Playing card prayers take a deck of cards or deal each person three cards. If a heart is drawn, they say a short prayer for someone who's special to them, if it's a spade they pray for people who work on behalf of others e.g. emergency services, teachers. If a club is drawn, they pray for those who are caught up in acts of violence and if it's a diamond, they pray for people's needs close to home and around the world e.g. food and medical care.
- Love Hearts take
 a Love Heart sweet
 and read the 'Love
 is...' passage from I
 Corinthians Ch.I3:4-7.
 Read it again replacing
 the word love with
 your name. Take a
 pack of Love Hearts
 and wrap a message
 around it for someone
 you love.
