Beyond transformation...?

Introduce the theme of these activities. This adventure will help us to find different ways in which we can worship God.

Activate

Now the sun is out and flowers are beginning to bloom we're reminded much more of the beautiful world we live in and of its amazing creator, God.

On your daily walks, some of you may have taken good photos of the countryside/things you've seen/your family.

If you're able to print the photos you could use them to create a scrapbook page or poster or, if not, you could make an online montage. Display all the pictures with captions of praise for the beauty your child can see in each one.

Reconnect

Create a prayer tent – you could put up an actual tent/tepee or make a den using blankets/cushions.

Then have some different prayer activities that your child could do in your tent:

- Strips of paper that they could write prayers on and then make into a paper chain
- Use a whiteboard to write 'sorry' prayers on and then use a damp cloth to wash them off
- Display pictures/models of homes, hospitals and schools and get your child to write specific prayers for people in those places.
