Plug in

Download

Watch the film *Finding Nemo*, where Nemo learns how much his dad loves him, demonstrated by the lengths through which he goes to find him.

Explain that Nemo's dad is like God's love for us and is similar to the story of the lost/prodigal son.



Activate

Create a collage, drawing, painting or other art creation, depending on the materials you have available which re-tells a story your child knows from the Bible.

You could use these to create an art gallery at home, and invite people in your household to come along to the opening night, or display them in a window for all to see.

Some stories your child might know which you could use:

- The lost/prodigal son
- Noah's ark
- The good Samaritan
- · Daniel and the lion's den
- David and Goliath
- Creation.

Reconnect
