Plug in

Show some electronic devices e.g. iPad/tablet, mobile phone, electronic/interactive pet, digital camera, laptop. Have a discussion about them, using the following questions:

- · How can technology be helpful/unhelpful?
- How much time do you think you should spend on the computer/internet? What are the effects of this?
- How can you share your technological experiences with your friends and families; what activities could you perhaps do together?



Get connected

Activate

You'll need: A digital camera/device with camera function.

Take a photo of something you can see in your garden or outside e.g. a flower, tree, or bird.

Whilst you look at the photo you've taken (you could print it if you're able to), ask your child to draw/paint what they see.
